

## Becoming a Multi-Sport Learning Facilitator



### Scenario 1 – LF Candidate Follows the Coach Developer Pathway

1. **Selection:** The LF Candidate is selected by his/her respective PTCR (eg. viaSport BC, Coach NB).
2. **Core Training:** The LF Candidate participates in Core Training for Learning Facilitators.
3. **Content-Training:** The LF Candidate participates in Content-Training specific to the modules for which the LF Candidate has been selected.
4. **Co-Delivery:** The LF Candidate must co-deliver each module in which he/she has been trained in, and wishes to deliver independently.
5. **Evaluation:** The LF is evaluated by a Master Coach Developer, arranged by the PTCR, to determine if the LF has met competencies to be certified. The LF will be considered certified in his/her role as an LF, not by module, so only one evaluation is required between sports and contexts.

#### Notes:

1. Steps 2 and 3 may occur in reverse order.
2. Funding models vary by province. Typically, LF Candidates pay for Core Training and Content-Training, with Co-Delivery being unpaid. The LF may also have to pay for his/her Evaluation.

### Scenario 2 – The LF Candidate Does Not Follow the Coach Developer Pathway

1. **Selection:** The LF Candidate must be selected by his/her PTCR.
2. If the LF Candidate is not completing Core Training and/or Content-Training, the LF must proceed directly to evaluation. The LF Candidate must be evaluated for EACH module he/she is selected for, and wishes to deliver independently.

**Note:** Typically, this scenario occurs with LF Candidates in remote areas, where the region has lost a vital member to their LF team, or when new modules are introduced and it is not possible to arrange content-training.
