

COACHES BC LEGACY GRANTS

BACKGROUND

The Coaches BC Legacy Fund was set up in 2013 with the goal of encouraging more community level coaches to become involved, to further their education, and to receive training and/or certification. Each of the Coaches BC Legacy Grants has been named after a Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal recipient who was recognized nationally for their community service in sport.

The Coaches BC Legacy Grants include the:

- Norm Olenick Coach Developer Grant **(Open)**
- Gord May Coach Innovation Grant **(Open)**
- Kathy Newman Adaptive Sport Coach Development Grant
- Tim Frick Coach Development Grant

NORM OLENICK COACH DEVELOPER GRANT

PURPOSE

- The purpose of the Norm Olenick Coach Developer Grant is to assist with the education, professional development, training and/or certification of coach developers in BC.
- Coach Developers are defined as those that are directly responsible for the NCCP development of coaches. These roles include Learning Facilitators, Advanced Learning Facilitators, Master Learning Facilitators, Coach Evaluators, Advanced Coach Evaluators and Master Coach Evaluators.

GRANT RANGE

The grant awards funds that range from \$100–\$600.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE

The deadline for the grant is Thursday, November 22, 2018 by 11:59 pm.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- PSOs, Clubs, or Coach Developers can apply for this grant with the intent of utilizing/distributing it to coach developers as grants ranging from \$100- \$600

- Clubs or Coach Developers wishing to apply directly must include confirmation of support from their PSO or MSO
- Applications must clearly outline how it will be used by Coach Developers to further their education, professional development, or certification. Eligible examples include NCCP course fees, NCCP evaluation or certification fees, and professional development workshop fees.
- Selection will focus on Coach Developers who work with community level coaches

FOLLOW UP/REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Recipients (PSOs or clubs) are required to submit a follow-up report outlining the distribution of funds and the number of coaches impacted
- Failure to submit a follow-up report will result in ineligibility for further Coaches BC Legacy Grants

THE LEGACY OF NORM OLENICK

Norm is a nationally recognized Advanced Learning Facilitator who has been involved in the delivery NCCP Coaching Courses shortly after the program began in 1975. Recently, his primary involvement has been with the certification process of BC Learning Facilitators, and with contributing to their professional development. In 2013, Norm was selected by the Coaching Association of Canada to receive the NCCP Coach Developer Award. While maintain his close involvement with Coaches BC since its inception, Norm served on its Board as a Director for 7 years.

GORD MAY COACH INNOVATION GRANT

PURPOSE

- The purpose of the Gord May Coach Innovation Grant is to assist with the education, professional development, training and/or certification of coaches in BC.
- Specifically, this grant is intended for initiatives that go above and beyond and demonstrate an innovative or unique approach to professional development. The initiatives may also support coaches who are either in a unique situation (i.e., apprenticing, geographically isolated) or have overcome adversity.

GRANT RANGE

The grant awards funds that range from \$100–\$600.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE

The deadline for the grant is Thursday, November 22, 2018 by 11:59 pm.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- PSOs or clubs can apply for this grant with the intent of supporting 1 or more initiatives that enhance the professional development of coaches
- Clubs wishing to apply directly must include confirmation of support from their PSO
- Applications must clearly outline the innovation behind this initiative and how it will be used to further the education, professional development, or certification of coaches
- Eligible examples could include (but are not limited to):
 - Coach visitation - offset the costs of hosting an “expert” coach from within the province, country, or internationally to conduct clinics or workshops for community coaches
 - Cross-sport coach education and collaboration; Mentorship opportunities
- Technology related activities that are innovative and able to demonstrate a positive impact to the professional development of community coaches
- Selection will focus on supporting community coaches Selection will focus on supporting community coaches including parents, teachers, students (ages 16+) and entry level coaches

THE LEGACY OF GORD MAY

Gord May was the founding Executive Director of Coaches BC from 1993-2012. He was a provincial and national leader in the sport sector and a friend to countless coaches, co-workers, partner organizations and their employees. He was an advocate for coaches and coaching education knowing that “at the heart of quality sport is good coaching”. (Richard Way, Perspective Special Edition 2013)

KATHY NEWMAN ADAPTIVE SPORT COACH GRANT

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Kathy Newman Adaptive Sport Coach Development Grant is to assist with the education, professional development, training and/or certification of coaches who work with athletes with disabilities.

GRANT RANGE

The grant awards funds that range from \$100–\$600.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE

This grant is not available for the Fall intake

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- PSOs or clubs can apply for this grant with the intent of utilizing/distributing it to coaches as grants ranging from \$100–\$600
- Clubs wishing to apply directly must include confirmation of support from their PSO
- Applications must clearly outline how the funds will be used by coaches to further their education, professional development, or certification. Eligible examples include NCCP course fees, NCCP evaluation or certification fees, and professional development fees.
- Selection will focus on supporting community coaches including parents, teachers, students (ages 16+) and entry level coaches

FOLLOW UP/REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Recipients (PSOs or clubs) are required to submit a follow-up report outlining the distribution of funds and the number of coaches impacted
- Failure to submit a follow-up report will result in ineligibility for further Coaches BC Legacy Grants

THE LEGACY OF KATHY NEWMAN

Kathy is a recognized leader in sport for athletes with disability nationally and internationally. As the Executive Director for BC Wheelchair Sports for over 25 years Kathy was visionary and innovative. Kathy has received many awards including the Sport BC Daryl Thompson Lifetime Achievement Award and the ProMOTION Plus In Her Footsteps Award. A Board Member for over 10 years she was able to provide leadership and administrative guidance, adding to the progressive vision of the Coaches Association of BC.

TIM FRICK COACH DEVELOPMENT GRANT

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Tim Frick Coach Development Grant is to assist with the education, professional development, training and/or certification of coaches in BC

GRANT RANGE

The grant awards funds that range from \$100–\$600.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE

This grant is not available for the Fall intake

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- PSOs or clubs can apply for this grant with the intent of utilizing/distributing it to coaches as grants ranging from \$100- \$600
- Clubs wishing to apply directly must include confirmation of support from their PSO
- Applications must clearly outline how it will be used by coaches to further their education, professional development, or certification. Eligible examples include NCCP course fees, NCCP evaluation or certification fees, and workshop or conference registration fees.
- Selection will focus on supporting community coaches including parents, teachers, students (ages 16+) and entry level coaches

FOLLOW UP/REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- Recipients (PSOs or clubs) are required to submit a follow-up report outlining the distribution of funds and the number of coaches impacted
- Failure to submit a follow-up report will result in ineligibility for further Coaches BC Legacy Grants

THE LEGACY OF TIM FRICK

Tim was the head coach for the Canadian women's wheelchair basketball team from 1990-2009, leading them to 3 Paralympic gold medals and 4 World Championship gold medals. As the longest standing member of the Board of Directors for Coaches BC (17 years), Tim has made significant contributions to sport in BC through both his leadership and coach development. As a sport sector leader and mentor, Tim helped to develop the BPEC Degree at Douglas College and provides technical expertise as an Advanced Learning Facilitator with the NCCP program both nationally and internationally.

Tim has received numerous awards over the years including Coaching Association of Canada's Geoff Gowan Lifetime Achievement Award in 2009, induction into both the Canadian Paralympic Hall of Fame and the Basketball BC Hall of Fame, a seven-time recipient of the Coaching Association of Canada's Coaching Excellence Award, and the 2013 NCCP Coach Developer Award.
