OVERVIEW

The BC Games Coach Mentorship Program is a partnership between viaSport and the BC Games Society. It is designed to support the development of key mentors within the sport system, with the goal of increasing the capacity of sport leaders in B.C. The Master Mentor in the BC Games Coach Mentorship Program will support the development of a group of Coach Mentors leading up to and during the 2020 BC Winter Games.

The Master Mentor will:

- Support viaSport in the launch of the program
- Support Coach Mentors throughout the duration of the program
- Support the Coach Mentors at the 2020 BC Winter Games in Fort St. John
- Provide a written report to viaSport upon the conclusion of the program, using the template provided

Remuneration is will be in the form of a project fee. Amount to be determined based on the number of mentors in the program and will range between \$2,000-4,000.

- Post-Secondary education in sport, recreation, education or a related field preferred
- Respect in Sport – Activity Leader
